Session theme	Session content

<b>Plan 4 PrEP Toolkit</b> 9:30-10:45	Overview of the <a href="#">Plan 4 PrEP Toolkit</a> : Introduction to a series of tools that support national planning for the rollout of oral PrEP, with examples of how they were used in Zimbabwe, South Africa, and Kenya. <b>Demand creation</b> 1:30-2:30	Learn about the <a href="#">PrEP Communications Accelerator</a> (a tool that can be used to create demand creation strategies), and share examples of demand creation campaigns.
<b>CHARISMA Toolkit</b> 2:30-3:00	Learn about CHARISMA, an intervention and set of tools to increase women's agency to safely use PrEP by addressing relationship dynamics and intimate partner violence in PrEP service delivery.

<b>Provider training</b> 3:30-4:15	Learn about the OPTIONS PrEP Provider Training Package (focused on AGYW) and the WHO-Jhpiego PrEP Provider Training app.

<b>Building community awareness and acceptance</b> 9:15-10:30	This session will focus on strategies for community engagement and how we can incorporate advocacy approaches that “deepen” our engagement with communities to create a more robust enabling environment for PrEP use.
<b>BREAK: 10:30-11:00</b>	
<b>Supporting effective use and continuation</b> 11:00-12:30	This session will focus on the effective use and continuation-related considerations that are unique to PrEP and highlight a variety of implementation examples for initiating and supporting PrEP continuation.
<b>LUNCH 12:30-1:30</b>	
<b>Integrating PrEP into other health services</b> 1:30-3:00	This session will review the rationale for integration of PrEP and other SRH services, provide an orientation to PrEP-SRH integration models, and discuss technical considerations for successfully integrating PrEP-SRH services. Through a moderated dialogue, four panelists experienced with PrEP integration will share examples and lessons learned from real world implementation.

<b>Strategic Information (SI) and M&amp;E</b> 3:30-5:00	This session will address key data questions such as: What data should be collected? And why? How should it be used? Technical experts and implementation partners will share tools for monitoring and considerations for enhanced M&E questions.

<b>Relationship dynamics and intimate partner violence (IPV)</b> 10:30-11:30	This session will examine the effect of relationship dynamics and intimate partner violence on PrEP uptake and use with examples of efforts to address violence, transform harmful gender norms, and engage men.
<b>Target population discussion: AGYW</b> 11:30-12:30	A brief presentation outlining key insights and considerations around oral PrEP for adolescent girls and young women (AGYW) followed by interactive discussion
